About the Role

WWF Solomon Islands is seeking a qualified and experienced consultant (or consulting team) to conduct a **Mid-Term Evaluation** of the project "Scaling Integrated Community Based Fisheries Management to Build Resilient Communities and Coastal Habitats in Priority Seascapes." The evaluation will assess progress across project sites in the Western and Central Provinces.

The consultant will be responsible for reviewing project design, delivery, effectiveness, efficiency, impacts, and alignment with national, regional, and global conservation priorities. The role includes conducting literature and MEL data reviews, leading participatory field-based assessments in selected communities, and engaging with WWF staff, partners, and stakeholders. A strong emphasis will be placed on inclusive evaluation methods that amplify the voices of women, youth, people with disabilities, and marginalized groups.

The consultant will produce a comprehensive evaluation report, identify lessons learned, validate findings with stakeholders, and provide practical recommendations to strengthen WWF Solomon Islands' community-led conservation and nature-based solutions programming.

- Knowledge of WWF Pacific priorities regarding climate finance, international development and nature-based solutions
- Experience with project cycle management, gender, Monitoring Evaluation Learning systems and data collection methods
- Deep knowledge and experience of development in the Pacific region
- Previous experience in working with INGOs' and local organisations and familiarity with procedures, approaches, and operations
- Excellent analytical and writing skills
- Excellent verbal and written English language skills, knowledge of any local languages would be an asset
