# WWF-CAMBODIA AND THE MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT BEGIN THE NEXT CHAPTER IN CONSERVATION COLLABORATION

On 19 June, WWF-Cambodia celebrated the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Cambodia’s Ministry of Environment – a momentous achievement for both organizations. The document formalizes our ongoing partnership for another five years, committing to the joint protection of Cambodian nature through community engagement, protected area management and biodiversity research.



At our signing ceremony, WWF-Cambodia’s Country Director, Mr Vibol Chap, commemorated the occasion’s significance: “This is a valuable opportunity for us to witness a historic event – one that reflects our shared commitment to protecting the environment.” The Minister of Environment, His Excellency Dr. Eang Sophalleth, echoed his shared enthusiasm for a promising future together.

Our Sustainable Consumption and Production project, for example, will continue transforming our agri-food sector through improved farming practices and reduced plastic consumption. Other outstanding projects include SCALE-UP II in the Mekong Flooded Forest, which has fostered sustainable livelihoods from cattle-raising and fish farming to agroforestry and ecotourism.

Through this framework, we'll make a meaningful difference while contributing to national and global conservation targets.
