## SUSTAINING NATURE AND LIVELIHOODS

In Cambodia's Mekong Flooded Forest, rich biodiversity supports local and Indigenous ways of life. Poor governance, unchecked infrastructure development and climate change are now undermining the ecosystem's resilience and endangering community livelihoods.

Building on the successes of the programme's first phase, SCALE-UP 2 will continue strengthening sustainable livelihoods and natural resource management to create a better future for the landscape's people and wildlife.

*We apply a gender lens to our work to ensure women and youth are included in traditionally male-dominated domains. SCALE-UP 2 aligns with WWF-Cambodia's strategic plan for the Mekong Flooded Forest landscape, supporting four of its five thematic areas.*


Secure community rights to both land and natural resources



Support sustainable livelihoods (entrepreneurial and subsistence) and sustainable financing




Build community capacity to defend their rights, manage their resources and influence government policy

# THE MEKONG FLOODED FOREST



## KEY RESULTS BY 2026

- 1 Men and women from 14 community-based organizations have gained capacity to co-manage their secured territories and protect natural resources.
- 2 Two protected areas have developed and implemented participatory management plans, with effective protection of dolphin habitats.
- 3 In target communities, 500 households have increased their income by 15% since 2020 through sustainable livelihood activities.
- 4 Over 50% of households in target communities co-invested 2% of their profits in land or resource management.
