



WHAT SCHOOLS NEED TO DO

TEACHERS

- Sign up your school on the Teacher Portal (www.wwfwildwisdom.org).
- Once you have signed up on the Teacher Portal, request a class code for your students to use when they register.

This is a 3-step process:

1. Login and click 'Your classes' from the drop-down menu in your Profile button (top right corner).
2. Click 'Add class' and create a class with a Class Name. (You can create multiple classes or add all your students to just one class).
3. Create a class code by:
 - EITHER uploading students (via CSV or manually in 3 columns: student's first name, family name and email address), after which we will email them a class code to join your class.
 - OR by choosing 'Get class code' and giving this to your students directly yourself.

During the Challenge, you can view leader boards to monitor the progress of your students and your school in the Teacher Portal.

STUDENTS

- Sign up individually on our Student Portal (www.itza.io).
(Please note that for students aged 13 and under, their parent or legal guardian will be asked to give permission with a verified email address).
- Students choose an anonymised display name so their real name does not appear on the leader board.
- Students use their class code to join your class and play under their school banner.

Top tips

- To ensure your students have the best experience of the Challenge, they should use PC desktops or laptops.
- Ask your students to write down their login and anonymised display name (especially if they use more than one device).
- Ask your students to tell you their anonymised display name (eg Bear2134).

RESOURCES

1. Online Resources for Students - high-quality interactive content based on the key issues raised by David Attenborough in 'Our Planet' and 'A Life on Our Planet'.
2. Quizzes - there are three types of quiz, which students can do in their own time to test what they've learnt:
 - Anytime quizzes can be played at any time;
 - One shot quizzes give players only one chance to do the quiz, and
 - Live quizzes take place live online, with players going head-to-head against quizzers from other schools. Further instructions for joining a live quiz will follow.
3. Classroom discussion guides for teachers - available from 25th October.
